Since 1995, we have reported that Amtrak remains in a very precarious Amtrak Financing financial position and continues to depend heavily on federal support to 18 meet its operating and capital needs. Amtraks passenger rail service has never been profitable, and through fiscal year 1997, the federal government has provided Amtrak with over 19 billion for operating and capital expenses. Amtrak projects that its fiscal year 1997 operating loss could be 783 million. In response to its deteriorating financial condition, in 1995 and 1996, Amtrak developed strategic business plans designed to increase revenues and reduce the growth in costs. However, passenger revenues have generally declined in recent years when adjusted for inflation, and at the end of fiscal year 1996 the gap between operating deficits and federal operating subsidies began to grow.
